March 8th through April 6th!



You've heard about it, now come see it with your own eyes!

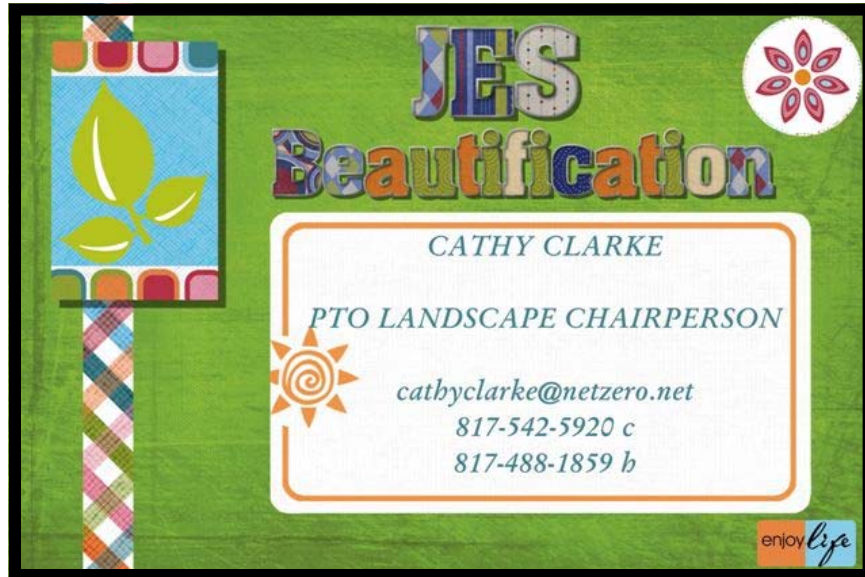

## PICK UP/DROP-OFF

***The safety of our children is our top priority!***

- Drop-Off: **NO EARLIER** than 7:40 AM and **NO LATER** than 7:50 AM
- Pick-Up – 2:55 PM
- **NO CELL PHONES!**
- No dropping off or picking up in the parking lot.
- No parking in the drive-thru lane.
- Please be patient and courteous to everyone!
- When picking up your child, you **MUST** have a sign with your child's first and last name prominently displayed in the window closest to the curb. If you are in the lane closest to the building - place sign in the passenger window. If you are in the lane closest to the parking lot - place sign in the driver window. If you park to pick up your children, please remain in the designated "wait" area in our lot, hold the sign up, and our staff on duty will call for your student.



### VERY IMPORTANT

- *In an effort to protect our children, as well as provide a smooth and efficient morning car-rider line, we remind you to please follow these drop-off procedures:*
  1. If you are **APPROACHING JES FROM THE SOUTH**, please use the driveway just beyond Highland Avenue to gain access to the car-rider loop. **DO NOT** turn right into the car rider loop at the entrance near the parking lot.
  2. If you are **APPROACHING JES FROM THE NORTH**, please turn left directly into the car rider loop.

*Thank you for your efforts to make our car-rider lines run smoothly, and minimize traffic*

## BUS RIDER NEWS AND SAFETY

Parents, if your child rides the bus, please make sure he/she has a **bus pass** and it is visible to the driver (***it should be attached to the student's backpack*** - this year, the bus pass is white with black printing and says "09-10"). Also, communicate to your student that the bus driver will need to see the bus pass when he/she boards the bus in the afternoon.

As of last month ***students without a bus pass will not be allowed to board the bus in the afternoon.*** Since eight buses depart each afternoon from JES, we will be pro-active to ensure that all bus riders have the bus pass. Otherwise, the student will not be allowed to board the bus. The student will be brought back into the campus and a teacher call to the parent will be made.

Thank you for honoring the CISD safety and security procedures for our JES bus riders.

### CHECK IN PROCEDURE

- Please remember to check in at the front of the office before proceeding any further into the building. This is the safety of all students, including your own child.
- In addition the doors of JES lock promptly at 4:30 PM. If your child is participating in an after school activity past 4:30 PM please wait in the drop off lane and a teacher will escort your child to you.

### ABSENTEE PROCEDURES

- **If your child is absent, please call the school office to report the absence.**
- If your child has a doctor's appointment and arrives late, or leaves school before 10:00 AM for a doctor's appointment, please provide us with a medical excuse.
- Please try and schedule vacations while students are not in school. Our exemplary rating and school funding depend on your child's attendance.

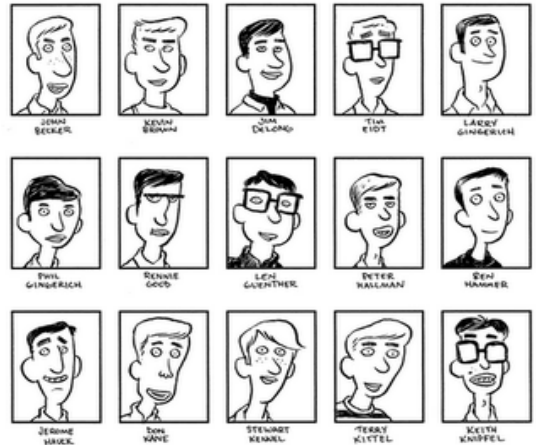

# JUMP ROPE FOR HEART 2010

Dear Parents,

During the next few weeks we will be emphasizing "heart-healthy" lifestyle choices in our Physical Education classes. As part of our activities, we will be participating in Jump Rope for Heart. This is an event sponsored by the American Heart Association. Our students will learn jump rope skills while raising money to fund lifesaving research and educational programs. Johnson Elementary raised over \$21,000 last year and was the top fundraising school in Tarrant County, #7 in the state of Texas, and #52 in the nation! Your child will receive "thank you" gifts based on the amount of contributions they collect, including two free tickets to Hurricane Harbor on Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup> for contributions totaling \$150. Our school will also receive equipment based on the amount we raise. Last year, we were able to get many new items including our Wii and Dance, Dance Revolution pads.

Family and friends are welcome to support your child's participation. We ask that children not go door to door or ask strangers for donations. Checks should be made to American Heart Association. We encourage your child to take advantage of the online donation feature. (Directions are attached). This year, the minimum donation online is only \$5. Our school is listed as Jack Johnson Elementary. This is a great way to reach loved ones who are not close to home. Every child will participate in the jumping regardless if money is raised.

If your employer has a matching gift program, please indicate the matched amounts on the Sponsor Form of the collection envelope.

Our Jump Rope Event will be on February 24, 25, and 26. We would love for you to come and watch your child perform the jump rope skills during their PE class. Collection envelopes will be due Friday, February 26th.
