Insulin



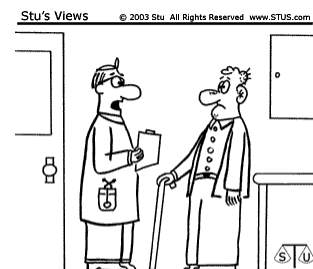

3. Scientist for a Day: Test Grade
