PUBLIC ACCESS DEFIBRILLATION

No school will make available for use and public access any automatic external defibrillator device (AED) that is not FDA-approved for public access defibrillation.

PROGRAM COORDINATION

The District nursing services coordinator will administer the AED program and will serve as coordinator for the AED program.

The coordinator will provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and AED training to campus nurses, certified athletic trainers, and coaches and will assist in coordinating the AED program with local emergency service (EMS) providers. Coordination with local EMS providers will include notifying all local EMS providers of the existence, location, and type of AED available in the District.

FUNDING The Board may accept public gifts of AEDs for placement at school campuses. [See CDC] The District may purchase AEDs if identi-

fied in the approved budget. [See CE]

TRAINING Campus nurses and/or certified athletic trainers will conduct cam-

pus CPR and AED training for District employees who are likely to use an AED and will schedule periodic practice of the skills learned

in the initial training program.

USE When an AED is used, the coordinator will promptly notify local

EMS providers and will provide a case review to the Superinten-

dent.

AED MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE The campus nurse will schedule periodic maintenance and testing of equipment, according to the manufacturer's guidelines.

MAINTENANCE The program coordinator and the athletic director will submit a

maintenance request in the annual budget. When an AED is no longer serviceable, the item will be deleted from the campus equipment inventory and forwarded to the central office for dispos-

al. [See CI]

STORAGE The campus principals and athletic director, in consultation with the

program coordinator, will determine the location of each AED.
