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FEC (REGULATION)

Remote Asynchronous Learning

In compliance with the TEA approved Asynchronous Learning Plan, the District will offer remote learning as a choice based upon the health and safety needs of students and families. All students who are learning remotely must document their attendance by showing engagement in learning each day through at least one of the following:

- Progress demonstrated through interactions with the district's Learning Management System (Grades K-4: Seesaw; Grades 5-12: Canvas);
- Progress based on interactions between the student and teacher, or
- Completing or submitting assignments to the teacher through Seesaw or Canvas.

Cancellation or Termination of Remote Learning

A student may have his or her option for participation in remote learning cancelled or terminated by the District if one or both of the following are true in any class:

- The student has a failing grade (69 or below) on his or her report card; or
- The student has three or more unexcused absences in a grading period.

Parent Notification

The principal or designee will notify a student and his or her parents in writing at least two weeks prior to requiring the student to return to campus for instruction when the student's participation in remote learning is recommended for cancellation or termination due to attendance or academic performance. [See FEC(EXHIBIT)]

Appeals

A student or parent may appeal the District's cancellation or termination of the student's participation in remote learning by:

- Submitting a medical exemption from a healthcare provider certifying that the student or an individual in the student's household has a high-risk medical condition as defined by the Centers for Disease Control; or
- Requesting a transition meeting, which will be held no sooner than three days after submitting the request. The meeting can be conducted virtually, and the student will continue to participate in remote learning until the meeting has been held.

If the result of the transition meeting is that the District determines the student cannot be successful participating in remote learning, the student will be required to return to campus for instruction.

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3. Further appeals will be in accordance with FNG(LOCAL), beginning at Level Two.
